Becoming an Eagle Scout has prepared me for being the Student State Board Member because I understand how to be bipartisan and identify the best course of action." Naomi says Scouting has given her the confidence to know she belongs in that room. Now, in her new role, Naomi will inspire a team that's about six million members strong.
